The Petition of Patrick Corr

A NATIVE OF Ireland

Respectfully sheweth: of Common Pleas of Philadelphia
That he declared on oath, before the Prothonotary of the Court, on the day of April A. D. 1887, that it was and still is bona fide his intention to become a citizen of the United States, and of renouncing forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the QUEEN OF GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND of whom he was at that time a subject. That your Petitioner has resided within the United States upwards of five years, last past, immediately preceding this his application to become a citizen of the United States, and one year in the State of Pennsylvania.

That he has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the orders of nobility in his own or any other country.

He therefore prays that, on his making the proof and taking the oath prescribed by law, he may be admitted a Citizen of the United States of America.

And he will ever pray, &c.
