

To the Honorable the Circuit Court of the United States, in and for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania:

The Petition of Felix Groerer
A NATIVE of Germany

Respectfully Sheweth,

That he declared on oath before the Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said County of Montgomery, in the State of Pennsylvania

on the 27th day of July A. D. 1887 that it was bona fide his intention to become a Citizen of the United States, and of renouncing forever all allegiance and fidelity to any Foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the

Emperor of Germany

of whom he was at that time a subject. That your petitioner has resided within the United States upwards of five years, and one year in the State of Pennsylvania last past, immediately preceding this his application to become a Citizen of the United States.

That he has never borne any hereditary title or been of any of the orders of nobility in his own or any other country.

He therefore prays, that on his making the proof, and taking the oath prescribed by law, he may be admitted a Citizen of the United States of America.

And he will ever pray, &c.

a Citizen of the United States of America, being duly sworn according to law, saith, that he knows and is well acquainted with the petitioner; that to his knowledge he has resided in the United States five years, and one year last past in the State of Pennsylvania, immediately preceding his application to be a citizen; that during the said period he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of our Constitution, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same.

Howard Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas in and for said County of Montgomery, in the State of Pennsylvania, personally appeared Felix Grover a free white person, a native of Germany who being duly sworn according to law, did depose and say, that he is a native of Germany that he landed at the Port of New York in the United States of America, on the 18th day of Sept. A. D., one thousand eight hundred and eighty that he now resides in West Manayunk Montgomery County, in the State of Pennsylvania; that he is about 28 years of age; And that it is BONA FIDE his intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign Prince, State, Potentate and Sovereignty whatever, and Particularly to William Emperor of Germany of whom he was before a subject.
